Dear friends in Christ,

Slowly, as the pandemic has run its course and the government and medical experts have valiantly tried to lessen its deadly effects, the haze over the future has begun to lift just a little. The one thing that seems to be becoming clear is that life will change once the stay at home orders are lifted. We know that without a vaccine or an effective treatment for COVID-19 we will have to continue to be careful about who and what we touch, the relative distance between us, the use of masks and other protective clothing and chemicals. Restaurants may have fewer tables and hyper-aware staff. Schools will have to consider how they function. Sporting events will likely look different. And then there is the church: how will we come back together safely? We are already beginning to think about that. I have heard that it is likely we will be returned to worship incrementally – that is, maybe only in groups of 50 or less. Can we sit separately together? How will we administer Holy Communion and Baptism safely? What about meeting for committee work or Bible study? The world is changing and we will think it through just as other generations affected by plagues have done in the past.

As I thought about these questions, the gospel lesson for this coming Sunday gave me pause and hope. It is the story of the Road to Emmaus in Luke's gospel. Two disciples are walking back to Emmaus after the horrific events of the Passover when, the day before, Jesus was crucified. Jesus appears and walks with them though they do not know it is Jesus. And opening up the Scriptures to them, he explains everything. Only later, when they are sitting down to eat, does Jesus reveal himself in the breaking of bread. The comfort I take from this story is that we are walking a road we have trouble seeing any good on, but Jesus is walking with us. Jesus will explain to us again – from the Scriptures – what we can and should do to be faithful to him. It is early on our walk. Trust him.
