Sauvage, who was born in Le Chambon-sur-Lignon, during the war asks why these brave Christians did it. He has some surprising answers. Half the video will be shown this week and half next week as we consider the Beatitudes which are always read, either from Luke or Matthew, on All Saints' Sunday. What does it mean, "Blessed are the Peacemakers?"


It's the time of year for saying "Thanks" Now through December 16th, 2019


